# *"The Footsteps of Lincoln"*

August 25 - 28, 2010

## Day 1 • Wednesday, August 25, 2010

Welcome Aboard!! Sit back and relax as we travel across Iowa and into Illinois for a three night stay in the home town of Abraham Lincoln, Springfield, IL. Along the way we will make a stop at the Mitsubishi Motors Factory in Bloomington, IL. Here we will see how automobiles are manufactured. After our visit we continue on to Springfield where we check into our hotel.



## Day 2 • Thursday, August 26, 2010

This morning we begin to walk the "Footsteps of Lincoln". Our trek begins with a visit to the Lincoln Home, the only house that Lincoln ever owned. It was in the parlor that the representatives of the Republican Party asked Lincoln to be the 1860 presidential candidate. Our next stop is the state capitol. Built in 1868 it extends for three blocks along a shaded tree street. After lunch we will visit the new Abraham Lincoln Presidential Museum. This museum not only preserves history, but makes history by enabling millions of visitors from around the world to experience the Lincoln story as nowhere else. After a full day we return to our hotel to freshen up. Dinner is on your own before we experience a walking "Ghost Tour" of the historic area. (B)

## Day 3 • Friday, August 27, 2010

Another full day of following the "Footsteps of Lincoln" awaits us. Our first stop will be the Lincoln-Herndon Law Office. Lincoln practiced law here from 1843-1852 with law partner William Herndon. Our next stop is across the street at the "Old State Capitol". It was the site of Lincoln's famous "House Divided" speech in 1858. This afternoon we travel through the farm land of central Illinois to the village of New Salem. The village covers 600 acres and is where Lincoln lived from 1831-1837. The village contains a grist mill, carding mill, Rutledge Tavern, schoolhouse and a saw mill restored to look as they did in the 1830s. Dinner this evening is at a local, quaint café followed by a performance at Theatre in the Park. This outdoor theatre is a perfect way to cap off our evening. (B,D)

## Day 4 • Saturday, August 28, 2010

Regretfully we must depart Springfield and head toward Iowa and home. Along the way a stop will be made in Nauvoo, IL located on the banks of the Mississippi River. Here we will look back to the History of the Mormons in Illinois before they began their journey to the valley of the Great Salt Lake. Having fled persecution elsewhere Joseph Smith and his followers established the settlement of Nauvoo in 1839. The temple was unfinished when the Mormons left in 1846. We will visit the Smith Homestead, Brigham Young Home, Browning Gun Shop and much more. Lunch will be provided in Nauvoo before we continue on to Winterset and home having walked in the "Footsteps of Lincoln". (BL)
